

What are the Benefits of dental implants?

- **Preserve facial appearance:**

When you lose a natural tooth, the jawbone will undergo shrinkage and may cause your face to look older. Dental implants can stop this process and in some cases, they help maintain the shape of the face.

Implant-supported replacement teeth are like natural teeth because they are anchored securely in your jaw. This allows you to eat your favorite foods in comfort and confidence.

With traditional practices, two teeth adjacent to a missing tooth must be ground down to anchor a bridge. Dental implants often eliminate the need to modify healthy teeth.

Because dental implants are securely anchored, there is no slipping or movement as there is with dentures. This eliminates some of the key worries of dentures, including poor fit, gum irritation, and pain from exposed nerves.

What type of dental implant solution would be best for me?

Whether you are missing a single tooth, several teeth, or all of your natural teeth, there is an implant solution for you.

Single Tooth With Ceramic Crown



The dental implant replaces the lost tooth root and provides a stable foundation for the replacement tooth. This solution both looks and functions just like a natural tooth and in most cases is a permanent solution. It also eliminates the need to grind down and destroy healthy neighboring teeth for a cemented bridge. A removable partial denture is a relatively inexpensive solution and will not destroy adjacent natural teeth as with a bridge.

Several Teeth With Non-Removable Ceramic Bridge



In this case, when replacing three teeth in the far back of the mouth, a fixed bridge anchored to dental implants is the only fully fixed, non-removable alternative. A traditional removable partial denture or precision partial denture does not offer the same stability or function.

All Teeth With Non-Removable Ceramic Bridge



When all teeth are missing or in such condition that they need to be replaced, a fixed bridge anchored to dental implants is the best permanent solution. Before dental implants, there was no fixed solution available for people who lost all their teeth. Today, it is possible to replace a full jaw with dental implants and a fixed bridge that results in a permanent, stable, and high esthetic solution.

All Teeth With Removable Acrylic Overdenture



A removable implant acrylic overdenture is a complete denture that is connected to either a ball abutment or a bar attachment, which in turn is anchored on two or more implants in the front part of the jaw. This treatment is considered the minimum standard of good denture care and will help keep the denture in place and provide better function and comfort.
